

Foster care children face **ENORMOUS CHALLENGES**

- **Less than 50% graduate from high school**
- **1 in 5 will be homeless after age 18**
- **Only 50% are employed by the age 24**
- **71% of young women will be pregnant by age 21**

By recruiting and training volunteers to advocate for kids in foster care, the Child Abuse Prevention Council of SJC is actively working to change these statistics for San Joaquin County foster youth. Our Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers ensure that foster children are not forgotten, but rather are afforded every single opportunity to have a happy and healthy life.

CASA is the only organization designated by the San Joaquin County Superior Court to recruit, train, and supervise CASA volunteers. CASAs act as fact-finders for judges, providing them with information gathered from court documents, social workers, educational, medical, and therapy records.

There are many more children who still need a CASA to speak on their behalf — in the courtroom, classroom, and community.

By being connected to a **CASA** volunteer, our children are much more likely to leave the foster care system and find a safe, permanent home.

MAKE A DIFFERENCE: The impact of **CASA** Volunteers

CASAs can change the direction of a foster child's life. They are able to focus on having a one-on-one relationship with their child, and are a consistent source of care, focus, and stability.
