Children in any unsafe environment, rely on the adults around them to protect them – it is our responsibility to ensure their safety. Now more than ever, it is up to family, friends, and neighbors, to be alert to and report any troubling observation, incident, situation, or circumstance to the authorities. Children living on our block may be suffering in silence.

If you see or hear something, please be proactive - erring on the side of caution. Failure to do so, may result in a child continuing to suffer at the hands of their abuser, or worse, result in the severe injury or death of a child.
